# Welcome & What Are Channel Revenue Tokens?

Welcome to the world of Creator Economy investing. This guide will walk you through everything you need to know about Channel Revenue Tokens (CRTs) — from the basics of how they work to practical steps for making your first investment.

## What Are Channel Revenue Tokens?

Channel Revenue Tokens are SEC-qualified securities that give Investors a share of a YouTube Creator's channel revenue. When you purchase CRTs, you are investing in a Creator's future earning potential. As the Creator generates revenue from their YouTube channel, a percentage of that revenue is distributed to token holders on a monthly basis.

*Think of CRTs like buying a small stake in a Creator's business. You share in their success — when the channel earns more, you receive more in distributions.*

## Key Characteristics of CRTs

- **SEC-Qualified:** All offerings are filed under Regulation A+ with the Securities and Exchange Commission.
- **Revenue-Based:** Returns are tied to actual YouTube channel revenue, not speculative token values.
- **Monthly Distributions:** Investors receive distributions on a monthly basis based on channel performance.
- **Fixed Term:** Each offering has a defined term length after which the revenue-sharing agreement concludes.
- **Low Minimum:** Many offerings allow investments starting from relatively small amounts, making Creator Economy investing accessible.

## Why Invest in Creators?

The Creator Economy is one of the fastest-growing sectors in media and entertainment. YouTube Creators generate billions of dollars in annual revenue, and CRTs provide a regulated pathway for everyday Investors to participate in this growth. Unlike traditional stocks, CRT returns are directly linked to content performance and audience engagement — metrics you can observe and evaluate in real time.

# How CRT Investing Works

Understanding the lifecycle of a CRT investment helps you make better decisions and set appropriate expectations.

## Step 1: Browse Offerings

Visit [invest.gigastarmarket.io](https://invest.gigastarmarket.io) to browse available Creator offerings. Each listing includes the Creator's channel metrics, revenue history, offering terms, and SEC-filed documentation. Take time to review multiple offerings before committing.

## Step 2: Review the Offering Circular

Every CRT offering includes a detailed Offering Circular filed with the SEC. This document contains essential information about the Creator, the revenue-sharing terms, risk factors, and use of proceeds. Reading this document is critical before investing.

## Step 3: Make Your Investment

Once you have identified an offering you are interested in, create an Investor account on GigaStar Market. You will need to complete identity verification (KYC) and fund your investment. The process is straightforward and typically takes a few minutes.

## Step 4: Receive Monthly Distributions

After the offering closes and the revenue-sharing term begins, you will receive monthly distributions based on the Creator's YouTube channel revenue. Distributions are proportional to your share of the total tokens issued. GigaStar handles all revenue collection and distribution processing.

## Step 5: Track Your Investment

Monitor your investment through your GigaStar Market dashboard. You can track distributions received, channel performance metrics, and your overall portfolio performance. GigaStarHub also provides educational tools like the Investment Tracking Spreadsheet to help you stay organized.



# Understanding Revenue Sharing

Revenue sharing is the core mechanism behind Channel Revenue Tokens. Here is how it works in practice and what determines your returns.

## How Revenue Share Percentages Work

Each Creator offering specifies a revenue share percentage — the portion of the channel's gross YouTube revenue that will be shared with Investors. For example, if a Creator offers a 10% revenue share, then 10% of all YouTube revenue generated by that channel during the term is distributed to all CRT holders collectively.

Your individual share depends on how many tokens you hold relative to the total tokens issued. If you own 1% of all tokens in a 10% revenue share offering, you receive 0.1% of the channel's total YouTube revenue.

## What Counts as Revenue?

Revenue sharing applies to YouTube AdSense revenue — the income a Creator earns from ads displayed on their videos. This includes pre-roll ads, mid-roll ads, display ads, and YouTube Premium revenue. Other income sources (sponsorships, merchandise, etc.) are generally not included unless specified in the Offering Circular.

## Example Distribution Calculation

Metric	Value
Channel Monthly Revenue	\$50,000
Revenue Share %	10%
Total Revenue to Investors	\$5,000
Total Tokens Issued	50,000
Your Token Holdings	500 (1%)
<b>Your Monthly Distribution</b>	<b>\$50</b>

## Factors That Affect Your Returns

- **Channel Growth:** If the Creator's audience and views increase, revenue (and your distributions) may grow.
- **Algorithm Changes:** YouTube's recommendation algorithm can impact a Creator's visibility and revenue.
- **Content Consistency:** Creators who upload regularly tend to maintain more stable revenue streams.
- **Seasonal Trends:** Ad rates fluctuate throughout the year, typically peaking in Q4 (holiday season).
- **Advertiser Demand:** Broader economic conditions affect how much advertisers spend on YouTube ads.

# Investment Limits & SEC Regulations

Channel Revenue Tokens are offered under Regulation A+ (Tier 2), which provides important investor protections while making these securities available to everyday Investors — not just accredited ones.

## Regulation A+ Overview

Regulation A+ is an SEC framework that allows companies to raise up to \$75 million from the general public with a simplified qualification process. Unlike traditional IPOs, Reg A+ offerings are accessible to both accredited and non-accredited Investors, making Creator Economy investing broadly available.

## Investment Limits for Non-Accredited Investors

If you are a non-accredited Investor, SEC rules limit how much you can invest in Reg A+ (Tier 2) offerings. The limit is the greater of:

- **10% of your annual income**, or
- **10% of your net worth** (excluding your primary residence).

This limit applies per offering, not across all offerings combined. However, prudent investing means considering your total exposure across all investments.

## Accredited Investor Status

Accredited Investors are not subject to the 10% investment limits. You may qualify as accredited if you meet one of these criteria:

- Annual income exceeding \$200,000 (or \$300,000 joint with spouse) for the last two years.
- Net worth exceeding \$1 million, excluding primary residence.
- Certain professional certifications (Series 7, Series 65, Series 82).

## Key Regulatory Protections

- **SEC Qualification:** Each offering circular is reviewed and qualified by the SEC before tokens can be sold.
- **Audited Financials:** Issuers must provide audited financial statements.
- **Ongoing Reporting:** Annual and semi-annual reporting requirements keep Investors informed.
- **Bad Actor Disqualification:** Individuals with certain legal histories are barred from participation.

---

# Evaluating Creators

Not all Creator offerings are equal. Use these criteria to evaluate potential investments and identify the strongest opportunities.

## Revenue History & Consistency

Look for Creators with at least 12 months of consistent revenue. A Creator whose monthly revenue fluctuates wildly may indicate higher risk. Steady or growing revenue trends are generally more favorable. Check for any single-month spikes that might skew averages — sustainable performance matters more than one-time peaks.

## Channel Growth Trajectory

Examine subscriber growth, view counts, and engagement metrics over time. A channel with growing subscribers and views likely has room for revenue expansion. Conversely, a channel with declining metrics may face revenue headwinds even if current numbers look strong.

## Content Niche & Audience

Some content niches command higher ad rates (CPMs) than others. Finance, technology, and business content typically generate higher CPMs than entertainment or gaming. Consider whether the Creator's niche is likely to remain relevant and advertisable throughout the investment term.

## Creator Evaluation Checklist

- Does the Creator have 12+ months of revenue history?
- Is the revenue trend stable or growing?
- Does the Creator upload content consistently?
- Is the content niche sustainable and advertiser-friendly?
- Does the audience demographic align with advertiser demand?
- Has the Creator diversified content or does everything depend on one format?
- Are there any red flags in the Offering Circular's risk factors section?
- How does the revenue share % compare to similar offerings?
- Is the offering term length appropriate for your investment horizon?
- Have you reviewed the Creator's social media presence beyond YouTube?

# Risk Factors to Consider

All investments carry risk, and CRTs are no exception. Understanding these risks will help you make informed decisions and set realistic expectations.

## Revenue Volatility

YouTube channel revenue can fluctuate significantly month-to-month due to changes in viewership, advertiser spending, seasonal trends, and algorithm updates. A Creator's past revenue is not a guarantee of future performance.

## Creator Dependency

Your investment is tied to a specific Creator's ability and willingness to continue producing content. If the Creator stops uploading, faces health issues, or experiences controversy, revenue may decline substantially.

## Platform Risk

YouTube's policies, algorithm, and monetization rules can change at any time. A Creator could face demonetization, reduced visibility, or new terms of service that impact revenue. These changes are outside anyone's control.

## Liquidity Risk

CRTs are not freely tradeable on public exchanges. There is currently limited secondary market liquidity, meaning you may not be able to sell your tokens before the term expires. Plan to hold for the full investment term.

## Market & Economic Risk

Broader economic downturns can reduce advertiser spending across all of YouTube, impacting Creator revenues regardless of individual channel performance.

## Regulatory Risk

Changes in securities regulations or tax laws could affect how CRTs are treated, potentially impacting returns or the structure of future offerings.

*Important: Never invest more than you can afford to lose. CRTs are speculative investments and should represent only a portion of a diversified portfolio.*

## 1. Educate Yourself

Browse current Creator offerings and use the evaluation criteria from this guide. Download the Offering Comparison Worksheet from [GigaStarHub.com/tools](https://GigaStarHub.com/tools) to compare offerings systematically.

## 5. Read the Offering Circular

Before investing, carefully read the full Offering Circular for your chosen Creator. Pay special attention to: revenue share percentage, term length, risk factors, and use of proceeds.

## 6. Make Your Investment

Follow the on-screen instructions to complete your investment. You will confirm your investment amount and agree to the offering terms. Payment methods and processing times are detailed during checkout.

## 7. Set Up Tracking

Download the Investment Tracking Spreadsheet from [GigaStarHub.com/tools](https://GigaStarHub.com/tools) and record your investment details. Track your monthly distributions and monitor channel performance through your dashboard.

# Frequently Asked Questions

## **Q: How much money do I need to start investing?**

Minimum investment amounts vary by offering, but many CRT offerings are designed to be accessible with relatively modest amounts. Check each offering's details for the specific minimum.

## **Q: How often will I receive distributions?**

Distributions are made on a monthly basis. The exact timing depends on when YouTube remits revenue to the Creator and the processing timeline specified in the Offering Circular.

## **Q: Can I sell my tokens before the term ends?**

Currently, secondary market liquidity for CRTs is limited. You should plan to hold your investment for the full term length. GigaStar may facilitate secondary transactions in the future.

## **Q: What happens if a Creator stops making videos?**

Existing videos may continue to generate revenue even if the Creator stops uploading. However, revenue typically declines without new content. The specific implications are detailed in each Offering Circular's risk factors.

## **Q: Are CRT distributions taxable?**

Yes, distributions are generally considered taxable income. You will receive appropriate tax documents. Consult a tax professional for advice specific to your situation.

## **Q: How is GigaStar different from Patreon or other Creator platforms?**

GigaStar offers SEC-qualified securities that provide an actual financial return based on revenue sharing. Unlike Patreon (which is donation-based) or creator coins (which are often unregulated), CRTs are regulated investments with defined terms and protections.
